




Just a few of the exciting books available at Mrs. Nelson's Book Fair!

Many know the song "Yankee Doodle Dandy," but few understand it. This silly picture book reveals that the legendary ride to town—and the whole macaroni thing—was actually


the work of Mr. Doodle's overeager pony. Mr. Doodle doesn't want any pasta or even a trip into town. No wonder he's so cranky! \$7.99

When the new small person enters Elmore's life, it seems that everybody might like it more than they like him. Elmore wants the small person to go



When your parents say you can get a dog, you feel so LUCKY. And after you finally figure out what kind of dog you want, that feels even LUCKIER. But when



It's Pete the Cat's first time visiting the library. He gets to check out all the cool books and discovers a few new favorites. With just a


little imagination, Pete goes on so many groovy adventures all the while staying in a cozy spot at the library. Includes more than 30 fun stickers. \$4.99

In this charming picture book, two brothers playing with gum on a rainy day get in BIG trouble. There's nothing to do. Ruben is bored. But things start looking up when his


grandmother gives him and his little brother some gum. Gum is fun. There's just one problem with gum—it tends to make a mess... \$8.99


right for her. This Caldecott Honor-winning story nudges kids toward independence, providing colors and patterns to identify along the way. \$7.99

The alphabet comes to life as readers are introduced to each letter with vehicles. Cars drive onto the page to bring in the letter C, and kayaks paddle


along to the letter K. Perennially popular subjects, such as planes, trains, and automobiles, all feature in this charming early learning book. \$16.99
