

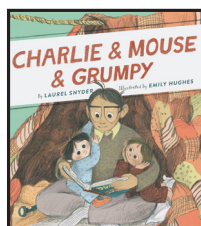

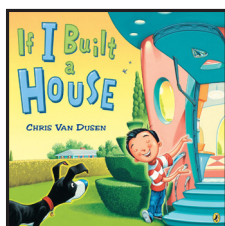

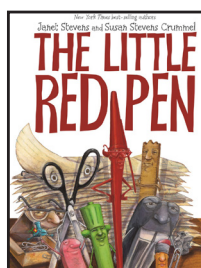
If I Built a House By Chris Van Dusen

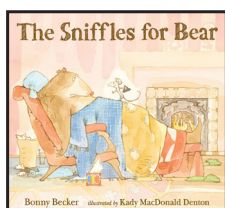
It Came in the Mail By Ben Clanton

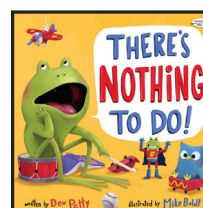
The Little Red Pen By Janet Stevens

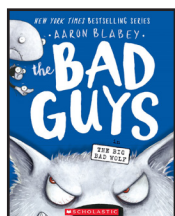
The Sniffles for Bear By Bonny Becker

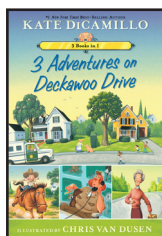
There's Nothing to Do! By Dev Petty

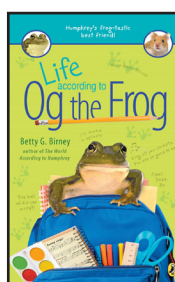
3 Adventures on Deckawoo Drive By Kate DiCamillo

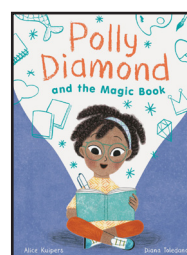
Life According to Og the Frog By Betty Birney

Cam isn't so sure. When The Hotel Between appears, they discover that

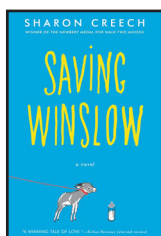

Thirteen-year-old Ben Ripley has been caught in the snares of SPYDER more than once and knows well enough to be suspicious of anything that seems too good to be true—

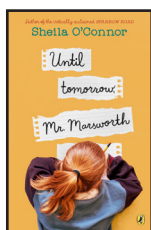

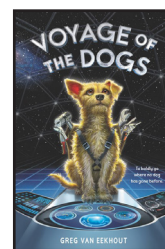
