



When the water gets turned off in Southern California (aka "the Tap-Out") after a long drought period, mayhem ensues. Alyssa's quiet suburban street suddenly





For as long as A can remember, life has meant waking up in a different person's body every day, forced to live as that person until the day ended. A always





Darius speaks better Klingon than Farsi, and he knows more about Hobbit social cues than Persian ones. He's a Fractional Persian—half, his mom's side—


