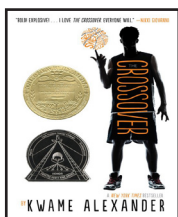

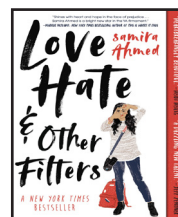
Crossover By Kwame Alexander

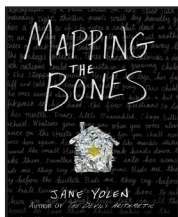
Dumplin' By Julie Murphy

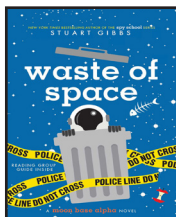
Love Hate and Other Filters By Saira Ahmed

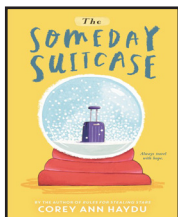

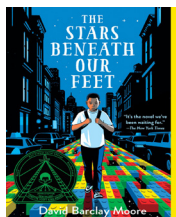

Clover and Danny are best friends who've had an incredibly close bond since they were babies. So close that Clover believes they're symbiotic: a science word which means

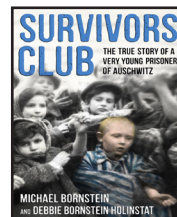

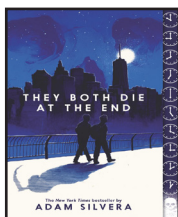

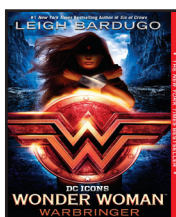

Stacy was raised by wolves. She's never needed humans to survive and, from what she sees of humans, they're dangerous. Together, she and her pack of

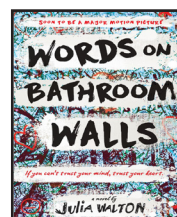
